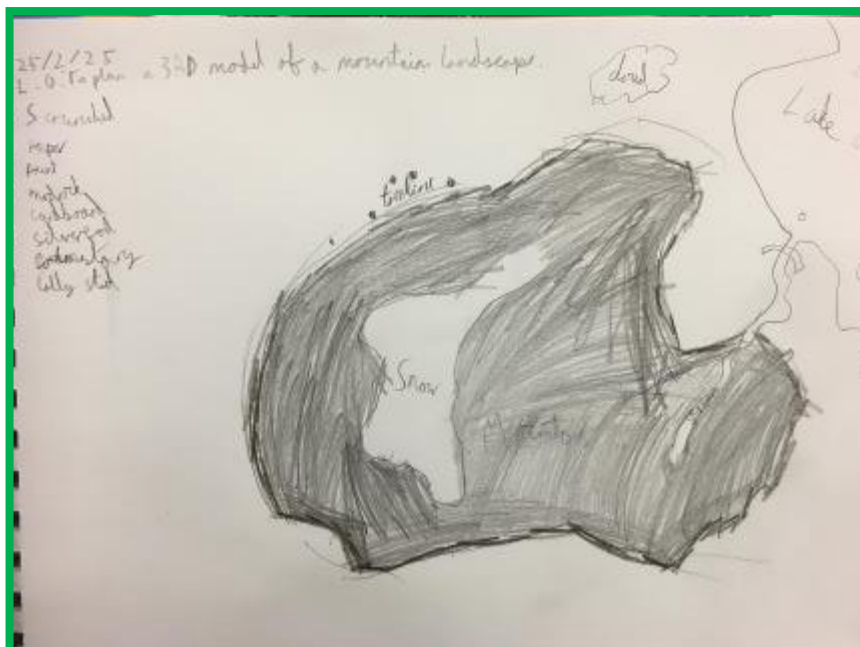

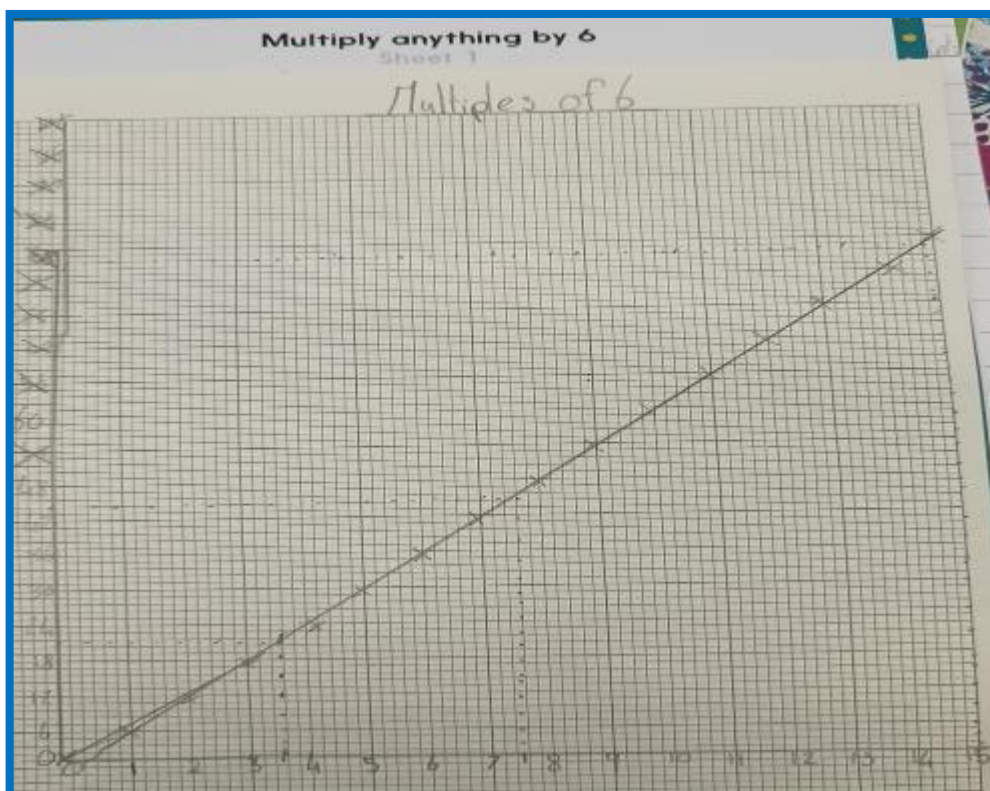


Homework reasons or excuses?

First Place - Class 2 = 97.2%

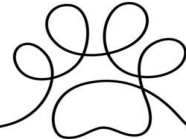


Second Place - Class 3 = 92.8%
